

In this programme, you'll gain the knowledge and skills to effectively build coaches and motor homes and fabricate and repair their components. Graduates will be able to work in a range of coachbuilding roles and will be capable of working unsupervised.

Programme outline

This work-based programme is made up of 130 credits and is expected to take 21 months to complete.

The training programme includes a mix of practical training and assessment, undertaken in the workplace, and eLearning, allowing you to complete theory elements of the programme at your own pace. You will have access to videos, interactive simulations and theory assessments, which can be easily accessed at any time from any device – mobile phone, tablet or PC.

Entry requirements

You must be employed full-time in the industry to enrol in this programme and have completed MITO's New Zealand Certificate in Coachbuilding (Level 3).
