

# Recognition of Current Competence (RCC)



**If you've been working in your industry for a while, then you may be able to get your current skills recognised towards a qualification.**

## **How does it work?**

Your MITO Industry Training Advisor will meet with you and your employer and take you through the process. If you are eligible, you will need to sign into a MITO apprenticeship or training programme.

Once you're signed-up, you can apply for a Recognition of Current Competence (RCC) which could reduce the time taken to complete your qualification. This involves a process where you gather a portfolio of evidence showing you already have the skills, knowledge and experience to be awarded individual unit standards in your training programme. This evidence will then be evaluated by an independent MITO assessor to see which unit standards can be formally recognised and credited towards your qualification.

## **What support does MITO provide?**

After the evidence you've provided has been evaluated, your MITO Industry Training Advisor will set you up with a training plan to complete any remaining parts of your qualification not awarded through RCC. You will also be supported with regular visits to monitor your progress.

## **Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)**

Additionally, if you have a pre-unit standard qualification or similar, you may also be able to have it recognised towards a MITO apprenticeship or training programme by applying for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). This can be explained in more detail by your MITO Industry Training Advisor at your initial meeting.

## **What does it cost?**
